


#### Early Education and Training Centre Parents Resource Centre

- Disabled children from birth to six.
- It is designed mainly for disabled children from birth to the age of two, providing them with early intervention programmes with particular emphasis on the role of the disabled child's family.
- Disabled children aged two to under six can also receive the service if they are not concurrently receiving other pre-school rehabilitation services, which will facilitate their integration into the mainstream education system.







## People **Ex-mental** Illness (People in Recovery

- Mental illnesses are medical conditions that disrupt a person's thinking, feeling, mood, ability to relate to others and daily functioning.
- Serious mental illnesses include major depression, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, obsessive compulsive disorder (OCD), panic disorder, post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and borderline personality disorder. The good news about mental illness is that recovery is possible.
- Mental illnesses can affect persons of any age, race, religion, or income.

#### Halfway House




It provides a transitional period of residential care to facilitate ex-mentally ill persons to achieve an optimal level of functioning for the purpose of community reintegration.



Referrals can be made by social workers to the Central Referral System for Rehabilitation Services of the Social Welfare Department.



Monthly fee: \$1,171 (\$1,220 taking effect from 1 October 2018)



# Integrated Community Centre for Mental Wellness (ICCMW)

- To enhance the social support and re-integration of the ex-mentally ill persons into the community
- Through the one-stop and integrated service mode, the ICCMW provides one-stop, districtbased and accessible community support and social rehabilitation services ranging from early prevention to risk management for discharged mental patients, persons with suspected mental health problems, their families / carers and residents living in the serving district through a singleentry point.

Provide community-based rehabilitation services for persons with chronic illness and their family members




