Nature of Fieldwork Assignments and Learning Opportunities:

•A combination of casework/ groupwork/ programmes/ projects is the possible assignments for placement students.

•Student workers have a lot of chances to interact with the elderly having different bio-psychosocial needs e.g. Singleton and Doubleton Elderly; elderly living with Dementia and their caregivers; Social Isolation; Elderly loneliness; Elderly living with physical disabilities; Elderly with mental health challenge (Depression, Anxiety); Elderly with suicidal ideation; Elderly facing life-changing health challenges and their adjustment (Parkinson's Disease; Cancer; Stroke survivor etc).

Students will learn the related social/community resources to support them and their caregivers.

Placement students are able to learn concepts and try out different care models/theories to work with the elderly facing different life events / challenges e.g. health adjustment; grief and bereavement; caregiver stress; empty nest syndrome; risk of elderly suicide. Some of the concepts/models included are person-centered approach; strength-based model; reminiscence theory; IBMS model; PERMA from Positive Psychology; Transition Theory; Stress process model; Cognitive Stimulation Therapy; Advanced Care Plan; Life Review etc

•For those targeting to work with the young old, student workers will work on Elderly Empowerment; Volunteer Development and Skills Development e.g. use of Gerontechnology

•Gain a chance to practice multi-disciplinary approach of care for the aged, working with other healthcare professionals and allied health practitioners such as nurse; occupational therapist; music therapist; art therapist.

Working Hours:

- Generally, working hours from 8:30am/9 a.m. to 5/6 p.m. (Monday to Friday) and occasionally on Saturday and Sunday for the settings of community care and support services.
- For residential settings, working hours usually from 9am to 5/6 pm. Saturday duty has to be confirmed with OIC due to a lack of social worker support on Saturdays. Worker needs to observe the routines of the homes, and the residents would usually sleep early at dusk e.g. as early as 6 p.m.
- For Part-time students: Please note that it is not a norm for placement students to work in night shift.

Special Requirement :

- Able to work in the daytime
- Be patient and possess positive mind-set
- Be able to appreciate their strengths and internal resources
- Ready to face issues such as Grief & Loss; life-challenging illnesses etc
- Be familiar with some common health conditions facing by the elderly e.g. insomnia; dementia; Parkinson Disease; 3 highs; musculoskeletal pain
